United Nations Forces in Cyprus

Betty V. Miller

When the trouble started in Cyprus early in December of 1963, I began sending out covers to the British troops stationed there. I don't send out covers to all trouble areas, just the ones that are of interest to me. I never thought that this would be the beginning of yet another album of United Nations Forces Covers.

On March 4, 1964 the United Nations Security Council authorized Secretary U Thant to send a mediator and a peace force to Cyprus. This force was made up of troops from the following countries: United Kingdom, Canada, Ireland, Finland, Sweden and Denmark. A medical unit from Austria, and civil police contingents from Australia, Austria, Denmark, New Zealand and Sweden.

The first of the UNFICYP began to arrive in Cyprus in the middle of March, and became operational at 5 A.M. March 27, 1964.

Not all of the British troops on Cyprus became a part of the U.N. Forces, and to date I have seen no official list of G.B. troops that did come under the U.N. command. To the best of my knowledge, according to information I received, the following troops were the U.N.

1st Battalion The Parachute Regiment - The Life Guards

The 1st Battalion The Sherwood Foresters.

The 1st Battalion The Royal Inniskilling Fusiliers.

The 1st " The Cheshire Regiment (This Bn. is still with the UNFICYP)

65 COY RASC - 3rd Infantry Workshop R.E.M.E. - 26th Med. Regt. R.A.

My covers from the British troops have the following Field Post Office cancellations; F.P.O. 1 and 2, both of these are machine cancels, 83, 129, 187, 600, 775, 1042, 1043, 1045. I must point out here that all of these FPO's were also used at the same time by other British troops in Cyprus.

Canada sent the 1st Bn. The Royal 22nd Regiment, and a Recce Squadron of Royal Canadian Dragoons, plus some RCAF. The present Canadian Contingent is made up of the 1st Canadian Guards, and a RECCE Squadron from Lord Strathcona's Horse (R.C.). The C.A.P.O. is 5001, and the cancellations in use are CFPO 27 and 28 (large and small)

The Irish sent the 40th Irish Bn., now replaced by the 41st Bn., and the 3rd Infantry Group. Most of my covers have Cyprus stamps, with town cancels, however I have a cover with G.B. stamps cancelled FPO 775, and a cover with Cyprus stamps cancelled BAILE ATHA CLIATH which to the best of my knowledge is a Dublin cancel.

Finland has its own postmark, it is supposed to be used only on mail to Finland. I have three covers with this postmark, two of them simply yell "Philatelic". The other four covers have Cyprus stamps with the Nicosia postmark.

The Swedish covers are the really tough ones to get. After many letters I have two covers, an airtletter with Swedish stamps and the SVENSKA FN-BAT CYPERN, also a cover with Cyprus stamps and a Nicosia postmark.

To date I have four covers from the Danes. All have Danish stamps cancelled KOB\* ENILAVH OMK with a single-line DANCOI/UNFICYP cachet.

My covers from the Austrian Medical Unit all passed through the civil mails of Cyprus. From the Civilian Police Contingents I received the following covers:

Australia: Two Cyprus airtletters cancelled at Nicosia, one of them has a boxed rectangle cachet "UNFICYP CIVILIAN POLICE/AUSTRALIAN CONTINGENT" (cont'd Page 43)

Some additional Facts to Supplement the Article Called "The A.P.O.'s of Japan in The Philippine Islands during WW-II" by Mr. C. Sharp Cook, Which appeared in the December Bulletin.  
Stanley C. Jersey

In the December issue of this bulletin Mr. C. Sharp Cook reported on Japanese Field Post Offices in the Philippine Islands from the original work by Mr. Masakata Seki, entitled "Studies on A.P.O.s of Japan (1894-1945)". Perhaps I can add some data from my files to this excellent research. Other information may come to light from other sources.

The Japanese postal structure in the Philippine Islands came under the control of the 16th Field Post Office Unit (Yasen Yubin Kyokutai) commanded by Colonel Saito Boichi with Headquarters in Manila. Each Field Post Office (Yasen Yubin Kyoku) in the Philippines was a sub-station of the 16th Field Post Office Unit.

There appear to be differences between my studies and the report by Mr. Cook. This may be accounted for by the fact that Mr. Cook's locations and dates were mostly from the 1942 period, with a few stretching up to 1945, whereas my study took in the 1944 period.

There were over 450,000 Japanese ground Troops in the Philippine Islands in 1944 and if only one letter per soldier was sent out this would add up to quite a number. But I am sure that they are scarce. With research they can be found. I collect Guam on cover from the Spanish period to the present day which includes World War II. I have been able to obtain three items from there during the Japanese occupation - 2 military post cards and 1 cover. And Guam was only occupied a little over 16 months. This was a Naval operation and mailing structure differs from that of the army. However I think the key to identity of all military covers lies in the sender's mailing address. Just as this rule applies to the USMC Unit Numbers used by the Marine Corps, I believe it applies to Japanese war covers. Mind you - this is an opinion -

The next big stamp event to take place in New York City will be the "Interpex International Stamp & Coin Show" at the Americana Hotel, 52nd St. & 7th Ave. from March 19 to 21, 1965. This show promises to outdo all previous Interpex Shows, according to Mr. Herbert Rosen's advance news reports. All the important philatelic organizations of the N.Y. area will have lounges and exhibits containing the finest possible material dealing with many different subjects, some of them possibly unique. Also a large number of dealers will have booths. Attending these Interpex Shows is an occasion for meeting many friends.

The W.C.C. together with the Spanish Civil War group headed by Theo Van Dam will have a one hour meeting on Saturday, March 20th, from 2 to 3 P.M. I might add that the SPA will have their Spring Meeting and exhibition at the show.

At the WCC meeting held on Saturday, Nov. 21, 1964 at The Collectors Club, NYC, there were 15 members present. It was an interesting meeting, with Kevin Rogan showing an album containing covers and other material from many small and large wars of the past. This collection is positively one of the finest I have ever seen.

The highlight of the meeting was the presenting of HONORARY membership to Thomas McGrath, for his devotion to the club by working conscientiously and faithfully as auction manager, which has resulted in our club gaining many new members during the past few years.

With re. to the Spanish-American War listing of U.S. Camps which appeared in the October bulletin, Jim Sorenson, WCC member #661 wrote in as follows: "I have a Span.-Amer. War Patriotic cover, cancelled at Omaha, Neb. and dated Oct. 18, 1898. The envelope contains a letter written by a soldier from "Camp Micklejohn" in Omaha, the date in the cover preceding the mustering out date of the 2nd Nebraska Infantry Regiment from Omaha, on October 24, 98. As far as I have been able to determine, this regiment was returned to Omaha from training camp, when the war ended and was assigned to guard duty for a time at the Trans-Mississippi Exposition in Omaha, before being mustered out". Therefore Camp Micklejohn is an unlisted one to be added to the listing of Spanish-American War camps.

Sidney Goodkin, #485 called my attention to the Japanese A.P.O. article in the October bulletin written by C. Sharp Cook. Mr. Cook was uncertain of a place called "Stockenberg". Actually according to Goodkin this refers to Camp Stotsenberg which camp was located in the hills just west of Clark Field. The 145th Infantry had quite a struggle with it for a few days near the end of January 1945, on the way to Manila.

Further corrections of Town names, Iuntarbam should read "Montalban", Bagabac might be "Bacalod" and Zasibaregar probably is "Zamboanga". I have been informed by another member that the Texaco Co. issued a road map of the Philippines during WW-II which was used by the United States Army.

It is indeed a great pleasure to welcome into the WCC as a member, Mrs. Edith Faulstich, who remarked when she sent in the application, that she has always liked the WCC and would like to become "one of the family". Mrs. Faulstich writes a stamp column for the Newark News and is also editor of the "Postal History Society of the Americas" journal. She has recently written a monograph entitled "A Find, Mail to the American Expeditionary Forces in Siberia, 1918-1920". For quite some time Mrs. Faulstich has been working on data for two books on the Siberian Campaign. One is to be a catalogue of the markings. The other is non-philatelic on the campaign itself. We wish her success on this project.

Member Everel Keys has written a monograph on the Free French Military postmarks of WW-II, which will be published in the American Philatelist some time in the near future. If sufficient interest is shown, it will then be published in booklet form. Also Mr. Keys is working on a chapter of Free French censorship markings and if WCC members should have any such that are out of the ordinary, please write to Mr. Keys describing them. Better still, send them on loan to Mr. Keys for a few days. Write to 14742 Center Ave., Harvey, Ill. 60426.

Contents of a V-Mail Letter mailed to the Editor  
of Yank, The Army Weekly

We thought that this letter, written by a G.I. from A.P.O. 7, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, on October 17, 1943 would be of some interest to memners. The letter reads as follows: "Gentlemen: The army has a very descriptive phrase for the way I sometimes feel about your magazine and all others regarding the covers, advertisements and stories contained therein.

"In your August 27th edition for instance, the outside cover depicts a stalwart Sergeant struggling manfully over the Aleutian tundra loaded down with ammunition. Another magazine shows a Sergeant dying bravely at his gun. A convoy train is guarded by, ah yes you guessed it; a Sarge toting an .03 and actually walking a post. A picture is snapped wherein Movie star so and so is kissing Sgt. ditto. The Podunk Railroad shows a whole carload of PFC's and up going on furlough. A machine gun nest full of deceased Japs is pictured with a whole flock of Sgts. standing around.

"Being a veteran of the Attu Campaign and having sweated blood carrying H.G. ammunition up hill and down, I resent the implication that all Privates are YARDBIRDS unfit for a place in ads or on magazine covers. Also I have yet to see Sgts. engaging in such menial labor. If the non-coms are going to fight and win all the wars single handed as the public no doubt believes by now, why in hell don't they send us, the lowly privates, home? Signed: Pvte S. Stephens (A dogface is no sea dog)."

Austria: Two covers, Cyprus stamps with the Nicosia postmark and the same cachet as above except it now reads "AUSTRALIAN CONTINGENT".

Denmark: Two covers, Cyprus stamps, Nicosia datestamp.

New Zealand: Three covers, two with Great Britain stamps both cancelled FPO 600, and the third with Cyprus stamps and the Limasol cancel. Sweden, nothing to date

The UNIFCYP is scheduled to pull out the 27th December 1964, but whether or not the mandate will be extended again remains to be seen.

Before closing these notes on yet another chapter in the United Nations Forces, I must add that covers from the British and Canadian Forces can also be found with Cyprus stamps and postmarks.

Lt. Col. Abdurrahman Conde, Postal advisor to the Hatuakelite Kingdom of Yemen has sent in the following news item:

A commemorative set of postage stamps has been issued in honor of the first year of the Yemeni people's patriotic resistance to the Egyptian invasion of Yemen.

The design of this set shows a Soviet tank of the Egyptian Armored Force being captured by Tribal forces in the Yemen Jauf region.

The Egyptian flag is being torn down and the Yemen National flag is being raised over the tank, as the Yemeni soldiers pursue the remaining Egyptians and shoot down a plane overhead.

There are five stamps in the set from ½ bog to 6 bog plus a 24 bog stamp in larger format, in an inperforate sheet. They are all sold at face value, the cost \$1.70 per set, also covers may be had with those stamps affixed (with gorgeous cancels), upon request. It is suggested that you send \$2.00 or more in a certified check to Lt. Col. Conde, Royal G.H.Q., Camp Al-Mansur, Qara, Yemen, ½ Postmaster, Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. Whatever the difference will be with the amount sent and what is left over, other stamps will be included.
