

# War Cover Club Now Military Postal History Society

As of August 15, 1991, the War Cover Club changed it's name to the Military Postal History Society and adopted a new set of By-Laws according to a vote by the membership on official ballots attached to the April-June issue of the Bulletin. A total of only 139 members cast their vote, and of that number 79 (57%) voted for the new name. Forty-six members (33%) voted to retain the old name, and the other 14 voters were split between naming the organization either the Military Cover Society or the Military Cover Collectors Society. The new By-Laws were approved by a vote of 138 to one.

#### Society to Meet at FLOREX 91

The Military Postal History Society will hold it's annual convention at FLOREX 01, November 1-3 at the Expo Center in Orlando, Florida. The exhibition will include a special Military Postal History section and an award will be presented to the best exhibit in this field. Both Stanley C. Jersey, MPHS President, and Jesse Boehret, MPHS Vice-president, will serve as members of the FLOREX jury, which also includes several noted experts in the field of postal history.

A meeting of the Society is scheduled for Saturday afternoon during the show, and it will be open to all, members and non-members alike. Members are encouraged to bring some covers for "show and tell", or to bring some "problem" covers about which they might like to learn more. Anyone wishing to exhibit in the show should contact our Exhibition Chairman: Alan Warren, P.O. Box 17124, Philadelphia, PA 19105 as soon as possible.

The UPdate to the second edition of the "Postal History of the AEF 1917-1923" was published by the Raven Press, P.O.Box 135, Lake Oswego OR, 97034 in the spring of 1991. Price: \$7.50 postpaid in the USA (Canada & Overseas ass \$2.00), check/M.O. should be made out to the War Cover Club.

As at always happens new information is discovered and faithful members of the AEF-WWI Study Group are sending me their findings. We want to thank Jim Adams, Karl Becker, Roger Bisch, Alec Swain and Joseph Taylor for their contributions. Gustav Pohlig sent us a batch of useful clippings for the bibliography and Ed Kroll a group of STAMPS magazines of 1941/1942 full of interesting information.

We incorporated corrections and errata for the original book here, they keep cropping up !

As with the fist UPdate we do note assign numbers to newly discovered postmarks, they will be listed as "VAR", eventually new numbers will be assigned at a later date.

Illustrations of the covers are generally reduced 67%, postmarks are shown at full size. Some covers could not be illustrated, since the photocopies we received were so dark that they cannot be reproduced.









#### On Active Service WITH THE AMERICAN EXPEDITIONARY FORCES

France, Sept. 7, 1917

my dear Thompson:-

#### INSIDE

Thank you very much for your kind letter of the bth of August, which I found upon my recent arrival at Paris, and purticularly for the kind letters of introduction to Sir Anthony Bowlby and to Director General Stoggott. I trust I may soon have occasion to present them.

By unit lumbeen assigned to take over a French nospital, which is now being ovacuated. It is attuated in a pleasant part of France, some five hours away from Faris, but not in the army zone. There is little prospect of our having much work to do at present and I think we shall probably be broken up into small groups or as individuals within the next few months and will be assigned to do work with the Allies, particularly the French, and visit their cities and institutions for instruction. In fact we have an order to make arrangements to assign each member in rotation for two weeks on the British front.

I don't know whether eventually I shall get to Dugland or not. I am afraid, however, not. I recently saw Dick Hart in Paris. He has, as you know, one of the Eritich nospitals on the north French coast. George Brawor was reconting working at the front and had with Darrada narrow escape from coasth from an aviator's boab, which killed a number of people in his immediate surroundings.

when we get settled down and I get around a mittle bit I will write you again and tell you how we are getting along.

War Gover Collectina

HE present issue of "STAMPS" is devoted to war cover collecting, a phase of philately which has attracted many devotees. As a matter of fact, what originally interested collectors of this type of material was the collecting of military and naval covers. However, the interest soon spread to other items pertaining to philatelia bellicosa and included such items as censored commercial covers, war slogan cancellations, red cross and prisoner of war mail, patriotic labels and posters and many other items of similar nature.

In May, 1937, a number of collectors banded themselves together for the purpose of assisting each other in the collecting of war covers as suggested originally by Professor W. E. Cornfield in an article in STAMPS. Professor Cornfield acted as temporary President and Merwyn Hertzberg as Secretary. Mervyn Hertzberg commenced publishing articles in Postal Markings under the name of the War Cover Club in May, 1937, and has since contributed regularly to that publication.

At a meeting in New York in April, 1938, the club was formally organized and Milton B. Hunt was elected its first President and Maxwell Halpern, Secretary. The War Cover Philatelist, edited by Delf Norona of Moundsville, West Va., and devoted to the collecting of covers of all wars, was adopted as the official organ of the club. Annual meetings have since been held in New York and Washington. The 1941 meeting will be held at the Hotel Hollenden in Cleveland, Ohio, March 28 to March 30 in conjunction with the 51st anniversary of Garfield-Perry Stamp Club. At this meeting there will be a special exhibit of war covers by collectors who are members of the War Cover Club as well as of Garfield-Perry Stamp Club.

The War Cover Club, although one of the youngest philatelic clubs

in existence, has already achieved many worth while achievements. For instance the club has adopted a classification system for listing U. S. World War Postmarks. Four instalments—dealing with military postmarks—already have been published, and the naval section is in course of preparation. The club also published a priced catalog of A.E.F. postmarks. A two page ar-ticle "World War Soldiers' Letters," authored by Delf Norona, Club Editor, appears in Scott's "United States Stamp Catalogue." The American Philatelic Society just recently published a handbook written by Hennen M. Sanford, present President of the War Cover Club, dealing with the subject of "The Mail of the American Expeditionary Forces 1917-1921." The War Cover Club also is sponsoring an intensive study of United States World War covers with the cooperation of club members. This work has been undertaken by Delf Norona and an exhaustive and detailed study on this subject will be produced in the near future as a Lindquist publica-

During the "Penny Black Centenary" at Washington special exhibits of war cover material were shown at the New National Museum and included a composite collection of members showing every type of A.E.F. Post Mark known. The War Cover Club is encouraging the inclusion of special war cover sections at philatelic exhibitions. Another feature planned by the Club is the holding of auctions of war covers and kindred material.

In addition to United States War Covers, the activities of the club include the collecting of covers and allied material of all wars, and the dissemination of information on such items. In order to keep the members fully posted on all such items, which have and are appearing constantly during the present war, a supple-mentary bulletin to the War Cover Philatelist is being sponsored by the club and known as the War Cover

Club Bulletin. This bulletin deals exclusively with philatelic material pertaining to the present war such as censored covers, military and naval covers, red cross and prisoner of war cards, covers and letters, war slogan cancellations, propaganda and patriotic labels and similar items. Such material is described in detail in the bulletin, which appears in mimeographed form once a month, and it is planned to list in the future all censor numbers, the dates on which they were applied, the origin and destination of the censored cover and in that manner conduct a thorough research as to where the censoring was applied. It is felt that now is the time to begin studying these various markings as they appear rather than wait several years. The Bulletin is published and edited by George C. Hahn, a member of the War Cover Club.

More than fifty collectors have joined the club and collectors, who are interested in this phase of the hobby, are invited to write the Secretary, John T. Buckner, Pleasant Hill, Missouri. The annual dues are \$2, which includes a subscription to the official organ, The War Cover Philatelist, and copies of the A.E.F. cover catalog and type chart. Subscription to the War Cover Club Bulletin is \$1 annually excepting to members of the War Cover Club, who can subscribe at a rate of 50-cents per year. It is time again to remind ALL MEMBERS to check their mailing labels for the expiration date of their membership.
