We exceedingly regret the delay of this issue. The hot weather, vacations, extra heavy correspondence in connection with the Bulletin, the Sales Department and our publicity and membership campaign, together with increased activities in the coal business, from which we still have to make our living, have combined to delay this issue. We are flattered that many members inquired whether their copy might have gone astray. This seems to indicate that receipt of the Bulletin is actually looked forward to by the membership.

In order to furnish our members a better service in connection with the reporting and illustrating of present war items, negotiations have just been concluded with Don Houseworth, Managing Editor of the "Cover Collector", one of the foremost magazines on cover collecting, to incorporate the future issues of the "War Cover Club Bulletin" as a special supplement in this magazine. Not only will members from now on receive the same information on present war items as heretofore, but such information will be in printed form, illustrations will be made from cut and photographs of specially interesting covers will be shown. This will mean better and more legible reading than under the previous method of mimeographing. In addition to the information contained in the "War Cover Club Bulletin" section, members also will obtain interesting information on other covers. Beginning with the next issue of the "War Cover Club Bulletin", paid-up members will receive the "Cover Collector" in which they will find the usual present war information under the editorship of George C. Hahn. Paid subscribers of the "War Cover Club Bulletin", who are not members of the War Cover Club will also receive the "Cover Collector" until their present subscription to the "War Cover Club Bulletin" expires. The directors of the club felt this step to be one in the right direction and of benefit to the membership as a whole.

There seems to be a misunderstanding on the part of some of the members as to their dues. In accordance with the new Constitution and By-Laws, adopted at the March annual meeting, dues are \$2.50 per year payable in advance on every fifteenth of April. In order to take care of those members, who previously paid their dues beyond April 15, 1941, their dues will be figured on the basis of 20ϕ a month from the date their dues previously were paid up to. In other words, supposing you paid your dues in July 1940. Normally this would have paid your dues to July 1941. Under the new regulations, you will owe for dues from August 1941 to April 1942, eight months at 20 ϕ a month or \$1.60. In as much as the philatelic publications of the club and all other privileges cannot be furnished members in arrears of dues hereafter, it is suggested that members take care of this matter at once. If you are in doubt regarding the amount owing, communicate with J. Paul Klinger, Secretary-Treasuer, 31 Hastings Avenue, South Ardmore, Pa., P. 0. Upper Darby, Pa.

The Sales Department of the War Cover Club is being of real value to the members, who are taking advantage of this service. Twenty seven members have subscribed to the circuits, about 35 circuits are circulating at all times and sales already have exceeded \$100, a nice increase since our last report. On Friday, August 22, 1941, a meeting of the War Cover Club will be held in conjunction with the American Philatelic Society's 56th Annual Convention at the Lord Baltimore Hotel in Baltimore, Md. Attend and meet some of your fellow members.

Francis J. Field, Ltd., of Sutton Coldfield, England, calls attention to their stock of censored and military as well as naval covers by means of their "Blitz Book". The price list is printed on remnant paper of blitzed stock due to their inability to obtain regular paper.

Linn's Weekly Stamp News, in one of their recent issues say: Censored covers are still the rage in the New York Market. Collectors grab them up as fast as the dealers get them. This is stamp collecting at its best, because there is a story in each cover." Censored covers are grabbed up not only in New York but everywhere! Through the kindness of Mr. M. Hertzberg, we illustrate above the marking described on page 7 of Bulletin 6. Does any one know anything about this item?





Field Service Post Card. On the address side is the designation of the card, plus coat of arms and notation to the effect that the address only can be written on that side otherwise the card will be destroyed. On the reverse side there is printed another warning that anything written beyond that allowed makes the card subject to destroyal. On this side of the card there are various set phrases such as "I am quite well", "I have been admitted into hospital" etc., for the sender to cross out all those sentences which do not apply.






