Flight of Ideas

In looking over my WW-II covers I have come across a few which have unusual markings or cancellations which puzzle me to the extent that I cannot figure out the Why's and w's of them.

Found an odd APO hand-stamp type A 1 (A40) sub type C (number removed). On top of ter instead of A.M. there was "LOC". These were dated 5/9/45 and 5/12/45. Apparently from APO 834. Stamped in purple.

Have cover from Hamilton, Bermuda 8/2/41 with purple oval handstamp "Bermuda Postage Paid" no return address or stamps on letter, sent to a commercial firm in N.Y.C. Was this sent by military or what is the story?

Cover cancelled Naval Air Station, Trinidad Br. pf 2/10/42 Stamped "Released by O.N.I. 9/5/45" Cover addressed to U.S. - Passed by Naval Censor". Why held over three years - what was O.N.I. - where did they hold this mail. This was a philatelic letter that had no enclosure,

I've seen two covers with R.A. of APO 839 (Guatemala) but one was cancelled in San Antonio, Texas and the other in Brownsville, Texas. Did they originate in Guatemala and get flown out and dropped in U.S. mail? These were dated April and October 1943 and were mailed by Chaplains. I also have an 839 cancel of May 1943.

Have cover with APO 523 in R.A. In double ring circle cancel it has "Unit 1". Is there a 523-1 in Iran. Our APO location book does not show it. Dated 9/3/44.

Cover from APO 246 dated April 1948 sent to soldier in Canal Zone. Backstamped San Salvador 4/30/48 in purple - on front of cover - straight line - large letters is "Extraviada" in purple. What does this last mean? Why was the cover in San Salvador?

APO 865 noted with date of 6/17/42 - earliest date I've seen so far.

Another earlier date to report - APO 514 A - 5/17/45, RA is APO 741. Old date was 6/5/45.

Have an APO cover with no number showing in cancel or R.A. dated 7/22/42. Censor mark would indicate England. Could be a first day from 505. Did APO 505 have the number in cancel when it opened up? It is possible that this cover could have been back dated after number was removed from cancel.

Check your English covers for various types of backstamps. I have one "Return to sender - Gone Away". This is put on covers where the addressee has been bombed out and no longer lives there. Another English cover with censor label "Censur F.N. FI". I understand this was Free French Navy in England. Dated June 1943. Who has more info?

Who has info on "Free Polish Forces" in WW-II. One postmark looks like "Foczta Polowa". Various numbers, 104, 112, 136 noted with dates 1944 to 1946. Member Dr. Henry Fenigstein wrote an article on this subject in a WCC bulletin several years ago, which article I cannot locate.

Gale J. Raymond is seeking to verify the existence of a U.S. Post Office or Postal Agency at Midway Island between 1903-1918. Anyone having such a postmark or cover, or info, write him direct at 6035 Hornwood Drive, Houston 36, Texas.

Did you know that during WW-II the 25th Anti-Submarine Wing was located at 65 University Place, N.Y. 3, N.Y.? (Later moved to Mitchell Field, N.Y.)

What date did our first troops arrive in Australia?

Sent a letter to APO 205 (Iran) 6/15/51. It was not delivered and was back-stamped "Directory Service 4/26/53". It was received back 6/16/52, one year later. Was there a fracas going on then?

O. N. U. C. NOTES

Indian Contingent

On March 16, 1961, the 3rd Bn./ 1st Gorkha Rifles joined the Indian Contingent serving in the Congo. I received a cover from the Adjutant of this regiment. In the upper right hand corner in purple is a cachet "O.I.G.S." which I presume means "On Indian Government Service." The cover also received a two line cachet "Capt./ Adjutant 3/1 Gr", and a double circle cachet which reads "3rd Bn. 1st Gorkha Rifles" across the top, and the date across the center. The cover is franked with Indian stamps and postmarked F.P.O. No. 660, 29. 3. 61.

The Indian Signals Company left India on Sept. 26, 1960 from Palan Airport, New Delhi, and arrived in Leopoldville on Sept. 28, travelling by way of Aden, and Khartcum. They were flown in by U.S. Globemasters. My cover from the Signals Company is addressed to Canada, is franked with the L'ETAT DU KATANGA overprints, and the c.d.s. is that of Elizabethville, 14. 3. 61.

There are now two Indian F.P.O.'s in The Congo, FPO 660 at Leopoldville, and a mobile FPO 762, the latter being brought into use on Dec. 19, 1960. I am fortunate in that I have first day covers from both of the F.P.O.'s.

Indian troops are deployed as follows: Indian Military Hospital, Leopoldville Detachment of Indian Military Hospital, Luluabourg. Another Detachment of Indian Military Hospital at Coquilhatville. Indian Supply Co., Indian Provost Section and Indian Field Post Office at Leopoldville. Indian Signals Co. at Elisabethville. Indian Composite Co. at Kamina.

Canadian Contingent

From the Chaplain with the 57 Canadian Signals Unit I received a ONUC air-letter, although this was addressed to the U.S.A. it carried no stamps, and did receive the ONUC handstamp. A later cover from the Chaplain received the Leopoldville meter cancellation.

Pakistan Ordnance Company

I received two covers from this contingent addressed to Canada, both of them receiving the ONUC handstamp, one in black, the other in purple. A third cover was mailed to me here in East Rochester, franked with the Congo Independence stamps, c.d.s. Leopoldville 15. 111. 1961, and on the reverse a double circle cachet in purple which reads across the top PAKISTAN ORDNANCE COMPANY at the bottom O.N.U.C. and date across the center.

Swedish Contingent

Two Swedish battalions have seen service in the Congo, the second and present battalion was formed specially for service in the Congo. I have a cover from the commanding officer addressed to Australia franked with Swedish stamps with a new type of postmark. It is a single ring and reads SVENSKA FN BAT KONGO the letter D at the bottom of the circle, and the date 14.3.61 across the center.

Nigerian Contingent

From the Nigerian Minister of Defense I received two covers, both of them addressed to Nigeria. The first cover is marked in manuscript "Active Service Posting Onuc". This cover is cancelled with the ONUC machine cancellation. On the reverse it carries a five line box cachet "5 Bn Group/ Uno in the Congo/ BP 7248/ Leopoldville/ Congo." Cover number two is marked in manuscript "Forces Mail (Free) On Active Service), it bears no stamps or cancellations but a triple ring cachet in purple. Across the top "Royal Nigerian Army" at the bottom "Contingent", a bar across the center reads "Congo", and above the bar 9 Mar 1961.

Italian Air Forces

I must say that I was more than a little surprised to receive a ONUC cover franked with Italian stamps, and postmarked at Pisa. The cover received a five line cachet on the front in purple "No 2 Squadron/ Unate N'Djilli/ O.N.U.C./ C119 Italian Group-Leopoldville/ 46a Aerobrigata T.M.-Pisa-Italia" and to the left alongside the cachet, "Liaison Office" to the right "Ufficio Collegamento". On the reverse a six line cachet which reads "46th Air Brigade T.M./ Sqdn. n. 2 Italian C.119 Group/ N'Djilli Airport/ 46th Aerobrigata T.M./ Sezione Congo/ Aeroporto di N'Djilli", The last three lines inverted.

Argentina Air Force

The first Argentine contingent returned home on Jan. 26, 1961, and I have not at this time been able to establish the date of their arrival in the Congo. The second contingent arrived on Jan. 19, 1961 and are scheduled to go home on July 17th. This detachment is made up of ten pilots and 13 mechanics, all working with the C47 Squadron. Have two covers from this small contingent, one mailed to Canada, the other to the U.S.A., both franked with Congo stamps, and cancelled at Leopoldville.

Ceylon Contingent

This contingent arrived in the Congo on August 18, 1960, being flown in by K.L.M. Airlines. My cover is franked with the Congo overprints, and the c.d.s. reads Leopoldville, 8.3.61.

Tunisian Contingent

After a great deal of letter writing I was fortunate enough to obtain a cover from the Tunisian Contingent. It's what I would call one of my "to heck" covers. I've written several letters to the Commanding Officer, to the Adjutant, and also to the Tunisian delegate to the United Nations, all with no results, so once again I said to heck with this and wrote to the President. The President's office got in touch with the commanding officer and I got my cover. It is franked with the Congo overprints, C.D.S. is that of Leopoldville 31.111.1961. There are two cachets in red, both of them three ringed, across the top of the first is O.N.U.C. at the bottom BRIGADE TUNISIAN and the coat of arms in the center. The second cachet reads across the top BRIGADE TUNISIAN, at the bottom LE COMMANDANT and the coat of arms in the center.

O.N.U.C. Headquarters

Late in December I sent a letter by way of Canada to Lt. Gen. Sean Mac Eoin congratulating him upon his appointment as Commander of the O.N.U.C. In February I received a card acknowledging my letter of congratulations. The card read HQ ONUC/ Leopoldville/ REPUBLIC OF CONGO/ Lt. Gen Sean Mac Eoin / wishes to acknowledge with thanks/ your kind message of congratulations/ on his appointment as/ Commander of the U.N. Forces in the Congo/ and regrets that due to pressure of work/ he is unable to answer each one personally/. The outer cover received the ONUC hand cancellation.

Malayan Contingent

I was informed by the permanent Mission of Malaya to the United Nations that the 4th Royal Malaya Regiment expects to join the Malayan Contingent in the Congo within the next ten days, the letter was dated April 11th, and this regiment should now be in the Congo.

Ethiopian Contingent

Major Gen. Iyassu Mengasha is the C.O. of this Contingent, and also Deputy Commander of the O.N.U.C. I received a letter from the Major General informing me that the Ethiopian Contingent arrived in the Congo on 7/17/60 and that it serves the U.N. in a very wide area comprising the Provinces of Orientale, Equator and Katanga.

Secretary's Report

Member August Hendelman wrote that he collects Civil War Covers and that he has the following: Covers from the 2nd, 3rd, 5th, 6th, and 18th Army Corps. The colors of the insignia differ with the Divisions. Mr. Hendelman also has two of the 9th and would like to trade one with a Detroit, Mich. cancel for one which he does not have. He also collects the G.A.R.'s along with the Women's Relief Corps and the Sons of Veterans. Mr. Hendelman would like to correspond with members who are similarly interested. His address is 2343 E. 70th Place, Chicago 49, Ill.

June 30th is the end of our fiscal year, therefore dues are in order as of July 1st. Only members who find a bill enclosed in this bulletin are required to pay.

There are several members of our club who have been of great help in various ways during the past year so that at this time the WCC is in better condition than ever before. These members surely deserve a vote of thanks. They are Thomas McGrath, Stanley Jersey, Betty V. Miller, James Russell and Harry Weymer. News Release from Bill Olcheski, Stamp Editor, Army Times Publication.
Washington - A full scale drive urging the issue of a commemorative stamp to mark the 20th Anniversary of the Civil Air Patrol now is under way. The anniversary will be observed in December of this year.

CAP Times, authorized publication of the Civil Air Patrol, reports on the drive in its April issue in the stamp column by Bill Olcheski.

CAP, official auxiliary of the United States Air Force, has a current roster of more than 35,000 senior members and some 35,000 cadets.

Civil Air Patrol members, adults and cadets, are organized into some 2000 units throughout the fifty states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico.

The Senior division flies many hours each day on search and rescue missions. In addition, mercy missions flown by CAP pilots are known in every community.

CAP efforts in the field of cadet training and aviation education have won recognition from such national figures as ex-president Eisenhower, J. Edgar Hoover, and scores of other dignitaries.

Miss Betty V. Miller who has been writing a series of articles in our bulletins on Congo covers she has received from all of the different U.N. contingents who are participating in the Congo peace efforts, writes in as follows:

That the covers are coming in very slow, however Miss Miller has accumulated a fair sized collection of them and that no two are alike. Every one of them are different, therefore there are no duplicates. Every cover Miss Miller has received up till now fits in her collection.

The work involved in preparing the covers, writing to the proper people, the expense in mailing them both ways (airmail to the Congo is 25¢ per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.), is such that it would be useless to hazard a guess as to possible value of any one of these covers. I have seen adv from dealers who charge as much as \$10.00 for certain recent Congo covers.

Miss Miller is in the process of mounting these covers on album pages and might exhibit them at some future Stamp Exhibition.

The United Nations Review for Nov. 1960 reported that Switzerland had a 22 man Contingent serving in the Congo. Miss Miller checked with the Swiss Observer at the UN. and found that the Swiss Contingent is made up of civilian technicians.
