## Report on INTERPEX March 25-27 1966 Theo. Van Dam

It was a great show and a good time was had by all---the most important feature was that our beloved Honorary Secretary Isadore Willinger was again well enough to visit us at the booth, and it was wonderful to see him back. We wish "Willy" many, many happy years with the Club and we rely on him for his council and guidance.

Kevin Rogan, our President, was at the booth, or acutally called "lounge", to meet all members and visitors. Some came from quite a distance; for example, it was a special pleasure to meet Betty Miller all the way from Rochester. We think we signed up quite a few new members; and we are certainly planning to do it again next year.

We have a new Secretary-Treasurer: John J. "Jack" O'Neil who "volunteered" for the job. Thanks Jack.

We shared the lounge with the Spanish Civil War Study Group. There were also a few members, of this group, visiting us but we feel that next year we shall go on our own.

EXHIBITION: We had a total of twenty-four frames, sixteen for us, the balance for the Spanish Civil War Study Group. Also, Drew Nicholson showed three frames: "The German Navy in the Battle of Jutland" with S.P.A. Since this was our first showing, we decided that this would be on a "non-competitive" basis and we did not award any medals.

However, the frames were unofficially judged by Mr. Willinger, and he decided that even when all exhibits were outstanding, special commendation should be given to Mr. Fred. Schmidt of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. for his "German Navy in the Boxer Rebellion" and to Kurt Adler for his "Russian War Covers". Both exhibitors shall receive a free membership in the Club for one year. Also, the exhibits of Edith Faulstich (French Military Covers), Dr. W. Reiner-Deutsch (Czechoslovak Legion in Russia) and Al Higgins (Aden Censored Mail) deserve special honorable mention.

The War Cover Club was especially honored that one of our exhibitors, Kurt Adler, received a Bronze Medal in the overall INTERPEX competition for his "Russian War Covers". He showed only two frames; so this did his magnificent collection little justice. Congratulations and thanks to Mr. Adler.

MEETING: The War Cover Club and Spanish Civil War Study Group met Saturday at 1 p.m. For a very successful meeting. Instead of dull reading of minutes, several members showed interesting covers from their collections. About 30 guests and members met.

Edith Faulstich showed some fascinating early covers of the French and Indian Wars; Phil Baker discussed the Spanish-American War of 1898; Theo. Van Dam had some Spanish Civil War material; Drew Nicholson; German Naval covers; Tom. McGrath: U.S. Naval covers; and our President Kevin Rogan; Covers from Viet Nam.

FUTURE PLANS: Next INTERPEX we'll have a meeting and most probably a lounge and this time by ourselves. Also, if enough members are willing to participate in a competitive exhibition. We think we could fill up about 50 frames and we have already several members who told us that they would be willing to participate and have the judges already lined up. About Sept. 1st, we are going to send out a questionnaire to members as to the amount of frames they are willing to send in, participation in setting up the exhibit (this is important; one or two people cannot do it) and meeting speakers. It is all up to the members to make it a successful show.

U.S. MILITARY AND NAVAL AVIATION IN ITALY DURING WW I

David D. Howell

PART I: U.S. NAVAL AVIATION

(Continued from April)

Austrian stronghold at Pola: naval vessels and air strength were but 70 odd miles away from American forces - the U.S. Naval Operating Base just across the sea at Porto Corisini - which already had suffered attack by the Austrian air forces. Even the waters under the Adriatic were hostile for this was largely controlled by the enemy's submarines. American offensive operations were still in "blueprints".

A sprinkling of interesting communications follows:

Thus Pescara, the proposed operating naval base, was never to play a role in any U.S. Naval aviation activities. On the other hand, Porto Corsini was activated.

Rome, Italy: the Office of the U.S. Naval Attache: Cmdr. C. R. Train promoted to the rank of Captain and, on October 16, 1918, Adm. Sims assigned Capt. Train the additional duties as Commander of U.S.N.A.F. in Italy. Previously, Lt. H. F. Guggenheim had proposed that during the initial period, American Naval Aviation's plans be called "U.S. Naval Southern Bombing Project" but that once operation commences, the wording was to be changed and "Group" substituted in place of "Project".

Politically, the United States desired to actively cooperate with our Italian ally against the common enemy; the Italian government had requested help by American forces and both governments were desirous of fulfilling their intended mission. America's representative, the well-known Lt. H. F. Guggenheim had made the political agreements, put the plans into operation for offensive actions and had made innumerable suggestions.

His singularity of purpose is best exemplified by the report of November 1, 1918.

PART I: U.S. NAVAL AVIATION. CON'T.

Almost on the eve of the Armistice came the following report:

Nov. 1. '18                      To Sims

(We) raided Pola with thirteen of our machines from Porto Corsini took part between 2 and 3 pm Oct. 22; forty-three machines in operations all returned hoping to repeat today.

Night of Oct. 22-23, enemy sent one machine back.

(for Train)                      From Rome, Italy

---

(Notwithstanding individual U.S. Naval air anti-submarine operations, especially Azores-based aircraft manned largely by Marine pilots, the above operation was probably the largest U.S. Naval air operation conducted during World War I.)

Irresistable Allied forces were to keep an inevitable date with history;

---

Nov. 8, 1918                      To Rome, Italy      (Train)

CONFIDENTIAL

483. Your 601. Maintain U.S. Naval Air Station Porto Corsini in full commission until demobilization orders are issued from here. Cancel all preparations for commissioning PESCARA. No further student pilots will be sent to Bolsena.

Your 601. 162008. 483.

and, the forces of the Triple Alliance were also to keep that date: November 11th.

For all practical purposes, the U.S. Naval Aviation Forces, in Italy, had come to the end of all their activities. In part of his 19 Aug. report, J.L. Callan had reported that the seven pilots lent to the Italian Navy now are being used to ferry the American Navy Capronis from Milan to Rome. As this was practically a joint operation, with the U.S. Air Service, this operation shall be detailed in a combined report of the two aforementioned services.

Like the U.S. Air Service in Italy, the U.S. Naval Air operations, at Porto Corsini and at Lake Bolsena (Training School) did not seem to warrant any special postal cancelling devices. The limited supply of mail, that has come to my attention, from both services, all have civilian postal markings (town markings) from the nearby towns where U.S. Naval or Air Service personnel were stationed. All is censored and some doubly censored by U.S. and then by Italian censors (altho the Italian censoring may have been a matter of formality). The return address is the key to this particular mail; thus mail may have originated at any of the towns or cities or nearby towns, the names previously given in this article.

After the report on the delivery of Caproni bombers is given, a bibliography of the Naval reference material shall be listed; and, after the U.S. Air Service report, the bibliography for that part to be listed. Sample covers may be illustrated.

LATEST FORCES AIR LETTER SHEET The Forces Air Letters bearing the imprint "5 A.M.S. (12/63)" at the lower left corner of the front panel has been reported previously in both watermarked and unwatermarked form, and with the word "SENDER'S" misspelled on the reverse. The error has now been corrected on the latest form which first come to my attention when I obtained a supply of them from the local town post office on 23 Feb 66. This latest form has several interesting features which are: SENDER'S now correctly spelled; the second fold line points to "P" of "plier" vice "E" of here as before; the arrow above the word "sender's" is broken on all copies I have seen; and so far, it has been seen only on unwatermarked paper. It is almost inevitable that it will eventually show up on watermarked paper but time alone will tell.

NORWAY CFPOs As previously reported, CFPO 5046 was made available for the Canadian troops taking part in NATO exercise "WINTER EXPRESS" from 27 Feb to 26 March 66 in Norway. I have received mail from an acquaintance who is over there and some was cancelled CFPO 5046 and some CFPO 25 both circular date stamped with hand cancels. Both were previously used by Canadian troops in the Congo from Aug 1960 until late in 1964 although CAPO was the term then in vogue (Canadian Army Post Office) vice the new term CFPO (Canadian Forces PO) which became effective 1 Jan 1965.

BRITISH ARMY TRAINING IN CANADA A previous article (of mine) mentioned that 168 soldiers of the 1st Battalion, Somerset & Cornwall Light Infantry were at Camp Wainwright, Alberta from 19 Jan 66 to 21 Feb 66 for winter exercises. Their postal address was British Forces Post Office 683, Calgary, Alberta. Outgoing mail bearing British postage stamps was cancelled "Field Post Office 129".

The British Army will be quite active in Canada from now until September. Here's the rundown as known to me at the moment:

- (1) Camp Wainwright, Alberta - BFPO 623 will serve more than 600 troops of the 1st Battalion, Royal Scots Regiment at Camp Wainwright from 20 April 66 to 25 June 66. The FPO to be used is not yet known to me.
- (2) Camp Gagetown, New Brunswick - The 2nd Battalion, Scots Guards will train at Camp Gagetown from 16 June to 25 July 66. No information on BFPO or FPO.
- (3) Camp Gagetown, New Brunswick - The 50th Field Squadron of the 36th Engineer Regiment, Royal Engineers, will also train at Gagetown from 26 July to 5 Sep 66. Information on BFPO and FPO to be used is not available to me at the moment.
- (4) Camp Shilo, Manitoba - A battery of the Royal Artillery will train at Shilo during Jan and Feb of 1967.
- (5) Camp Wainwright, Alberta - A British Army infantry company will train at Wainwright during Jan and Feb of 1967. No details are available as yet.

CANADIAN MILITARY POSTAL NEWS CON'T.

RCAF STATION LAMACAZA, QUEBEC In one of my previous articles I had mentioned that the earliest cancel I had seen from this station was 11 VIII 65. I have now a much earlier date represented in my collection and it reads 27 I 65. The cds, in use up to 4 Apr 66, still reads "RCAF STN LAMACAZA P.Q.". I still feel that it is just a matter of time before "ARC" (French abbreviation for RCAF) is included in postal markings from this station. Please let me know if anybody notices a change.

CFPO 26 This CFPO is aboard the sole Canadian aircraft carrier "HMCS BONAVENTURE". The Bonnie left Halifax about 18 April for Lauzon, Quebec where she will undergo a year-long major refit. 200 men will remain with the ship during the refit but how this will effect CFPO 26 is a matter of speculation at the moment.

UNIPOM (UNITED NATIONS INDIA PAKISTAN OBSERVER MISSION) CFPO 5000 set up in Pakistan to serve 117 Air Transport Unit and other components of UNIPOM ceased to exist as of 22 March 66. It began life about 29 Sep 65. 117 ATU has returned to Canada.

Late News: FORCES AIR LETTER SHEETS The forces letter sheet imprinted "5 A.M.S. (12/63)" and with "sender's" spelled correctly originally came to my attention on 23 Feb 66 in unwatermarked state. This form has also been issued watermarked "CHEM-EAUX BOND/MADE IN CANADA" and the only one I have seen was postmarked CFPO 27, from Cyprus, 1 April 1966.

UNITED NATIONS DETACHMENTS IN INDIA, PAKISTAN AND KASHMIR

About the time the Canadian 117 ATU reached Rawalpindi, Pakistan, the Pakistani Government set up mail censoring. Canadian personnel were able to use the Diplomatic Mail bag system for the UN meter postmark and the Canadian Diplomatic Ottawa postmark.

There are three types of Diplomatic UN mail cancels:

- (A) The slogan UNNY meter cancel.
- (B) Meter tape over the Canadian CFPO 5000 cancel and 5¢ adhesive stamp.
- (C) UNNY stamps on Canadian ALS.

On the approximately 100 "front" to be patrolled, the following countries were represented. (UNIPOM 9-23-65/3-22-66) (Approximate numbers of personnel involved.)

UNMOGIP

The United Nations Military Observer Group in India and Pakistan began 7-29-49 and is still active. Operation was in force since 1949 with 45 UN Aids to patrol a cease-fire line of about 500 miles. Eleven nations are involved with Lt. General H. Nommo of Australia as "top" men. On September 23, 1965, 180 additional observers sent on account of the "flareup" over Kashmir.
