WAR COVER CLUB MEMBERS "IN THE NEWS"INTERPEX (Reported by Theo. Van Dam)

A memorable occasion: Organized by Jack Donoghue, Isadore Willinger was honored, for his long and notable service to the War Cover Club, by a "surprise" luncheon wherein he was presented with an engraved pen and pencil set by Kevin Regan, President of the War Cover Club. Amongst the guests, honoring Willinger, were three other presidents of national philatelic societies: Edward L. Willard, American Philatelic Society; from the Postal History of the Americas, Mrs. Edith Faulstich; and from the Aero Philatelists Inc., William N. Mead. Furthermore, other noted philatelists enhanced this event.

In addition to the luncheon, the Club meeting, listing the War Cover Club exhibits and speakers (see February Bulletin), Theo. Van Dam reports the exhibit awards:

The Postal History Award to Frederick A. Schmidt for his fine "100 Years North German Lloyd Atlantic Crossings".

Bronze to James Russell for "Covers Cancelled Aboard U.S. Naval Vessels in Tokyo Bay at End of World War II".

Honorable Mention to Capt. H. F. Remmel, U.S.N. for "Introduction to Paquet Civil War Covers".

Gold to Donald M. McPherson for "Wings of Our Navy" Flown Covers of Navy Planes and Dirigibles and "Fly Over" Covers from Ships on Flight Lines.

Comments: A number of War Cover Club members (non-winners of awards) participated in WESTPEX primarily in the Universal Ship Cancellation Section; also the U.S.C.S. had an Awards Luncheon on the day following the WESTPEX Awards Dinner. (It was my pleasure to meet several distinguished U.S.C.S. members, at the luncheon, and to win a Deer Prize)

W. H. Wells' display included the rarities and errors of the special issues. Don McPherson's displayed one of the rare U.S.S. MACON drop-mail flight covers which was autographed by President Roosevelt on board the U.S.S. HOUSTON at sea July of 1934.

MILITARY POST OF ITALIAN EAST AFRICA 1935-41

W. G. Weisbecker *

(Reference: Bulletins of April, June, August and October of 1965)

Miscellaneous Notes: Almost all offices of the Italian military post in East Africa used, in addition to circular cancels, either machine or handstruck linear cancels of one or two lines (particularly on registered mail) and a boxed strike with the military post number and the word "Titolare" (presumably used for official post office correspondence).

Pesta Militare Nos. 101, 102, 103, 104, 105 and 106 -- used by the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Italian Black Shirt Divisions in East Africa during the Ethiopian campaign and after -- were discontinued at the end of 1937 (or early in 1938).

The first Italian military post office opened in East Africa for the Ethiopian campaign was Pesta Militare 98, at Mogadiscio, Somalia, on 22 April 1935, for use of the 27th "Peloritana" Infantry Division -- first major Italian Army unit to arrive by sea from Italy. (Some say this office was opened as early as February 1935, when the first units of the Division began arriving in Somalia, but I find no official confirmation of this).

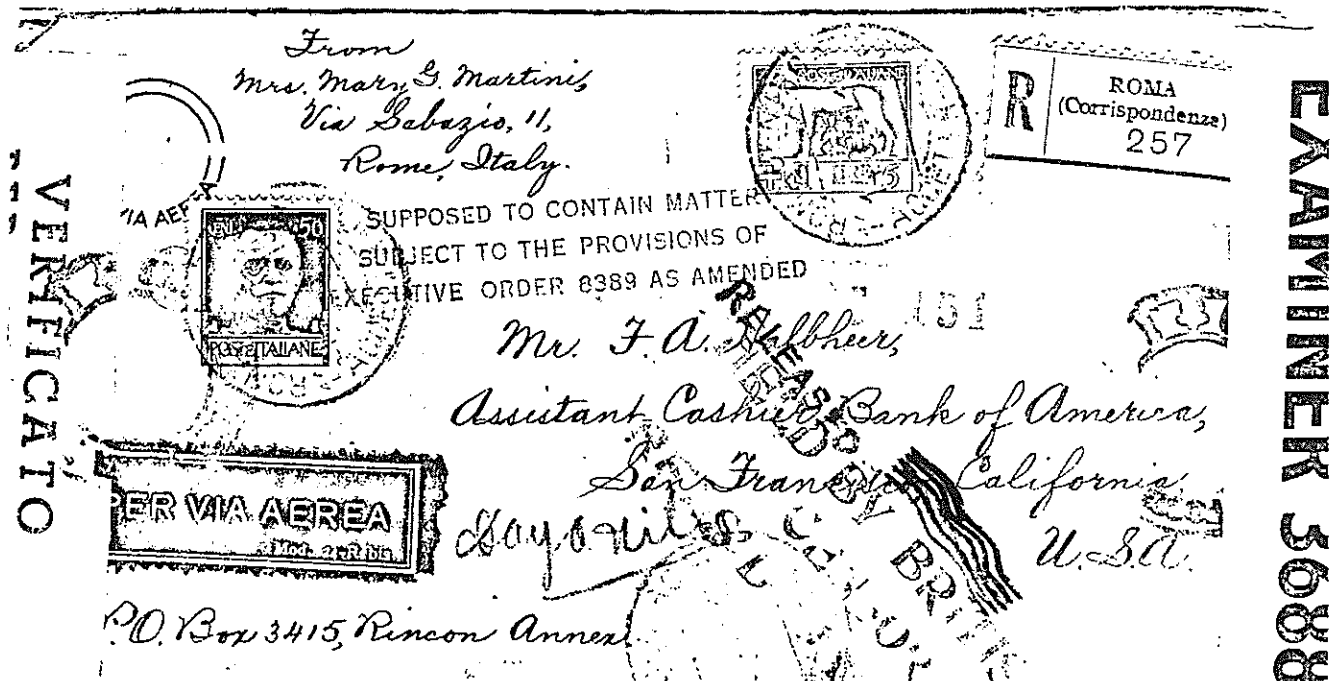
(1) I am still unconvinced that this P.M. was ever used in East Africa; according to my information, it was used by the "Ariete" Division for no longer than three weeks (17th October-6th November 1935 - but only in Italian Libya.

(2) Similarly, I believe P.M. 109 to have been used by the "Trente" Motorized Division for seven months (31st December 1935 - 18th Sept. 1936) - but only in Italian Cyrenaica.

(3) Here, too, my opinion is that P.M. 132 was used by the "Assietta II.a" Division for six-and-one-half months (6th March - 20th August 1936) - but only in Italian Cyrenaica.

Registered air mail with Italian, British and U.S. censor markings but held by the British censor for five years has the cachet "HELD BY BRITISH/CENSOR/RELS'D JAN 1946" and the U.S. cachet "SUSPENDED TO CONTAIN MATTER/SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF/ EXECUTIVE ORDER 8389 AS AMENDED" plus the British wavy-line marking "RELEASED".

COPYING SERVICE

Any War Cover Club Library materials, in the hands of the Librarian, may be copied for 10¢ per page. Xerox service is available in 8 1/2 x 11 inch size and makes excellent copies. In many cases, members may find it cheaper to have Xerox copies made of required information than to pay postage both ways to and from the Librarian.

Your Librarian is also associated with the University of Illinois Library which has a collection of over 90 shelves of philatelic books and periodicals. Xerox and microfilm copies of any of this material will be obtained for WCC members at cost by the Club Librarian.

COPYING ARTICLES IN NON-PHILATELIC MAGAZINES

Many excellent articles appear in non-philatelic magazines that are of interest to the serious war cover collector. Periodicals such as American Legion Magazine, Infantry Journal, U.S. Naval Institute Proceedings, Kiwanis Magazine, National Geographic Magazine, etc. often carry articles containing data valuable to the war cover specialist. These magazines, and many others, are held by the University of Illinois.

At a cost of 10¢ per page, plus postage, your Librarian can obtain Xerox copies of articles from these magazines. Should you wish to have something copied, please contact your Librarian to see if it is available.

SUBJECT MATTER BIBLIOGRAPHIES

Excellent subject matter bibliographies have appeared in past issues of the WCC Bulletin. Would the membership be interested in developing selected bibliographies to be filed with the Librarian for loan to other members, particularly the newer ones?

Bibliographies that have already appeared could be Xeroxed and brought up-to-date for current use. At least two such bibliographies have appeared in past issues on the subject of the British military forces and the American Expeditionary Force. I'm sure that we could get others prepared on the Siberian intervention, Spanish American War, UN Forces, Korean War and so forth.

CUMULATIVE INDEX OF WCC BULLETIN

From time to time an index of selected issues of the War Cover Club Bulletin has appeared but there is not a comprehensive index of past Bulletins in any one place. Would the membership be interested in such an index?

With the copying services now available, it would not be difficult to put together a cumulative index of the Bulletin covering the past six to eight years. This could be done at a modest cost but the Librarian would have to recover the costs through a small charge for the loan of the index. I would estimate that the charge would be 10¢ to 15¢ per loan.

Members wishing their own personal copy of such an index could receive one at a cost of 10¢ per page for Xerox service.

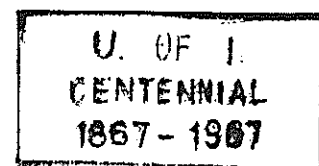

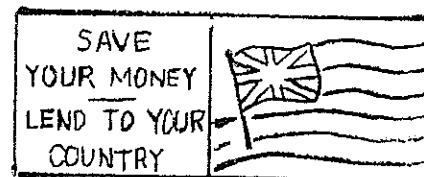

The Armed Forces Tattee shall travel across the nation for about five months and utilize various military post offices; details shall be provided whenever available.

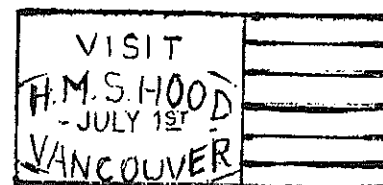
SLOGAN CHECK LIST

The attractive machine slogans, of World War I vintage, are much sought after by collectors of military mail. Patriotic slogans, especially these incorporating the Flag in the design, are most desirable but hard to find. Apparently, there is no accurate listing of these early slogans.

Patriotic slogans continued in the post-World War I period. Collecting the Vancouver, B. C. slogan post marks is a specialty in itself. Among the scarcest, originating from Vancouver, is the slogan of 1924, the visit date of the H.M.S. HOOD. The later tragic events are recalled by the ship's name; it seems only yesterday.

"C. O. D. -- CODFISH AIRLINES"

The United States Navy Ship-to-Shore--Shore-to-Ship Air Mail-Passenger Service
CDR Robert W. Murch, U.S.N.

Shortly after the outbreak of the Korean War, major units of the U.S. Fleet were rushed to the Sea of Japan to operate off the Korean coast to support Army and Marine Corps units heavily engaged in land combat. Task Force 77, composed of hard-hitting, long-ranging aircraft carriers, cruisers, and destroyers were deployed at sea for weeks and months on end. It became the mission of Navy Air Transport Squadron 23, based at Atsugi, Japan, to ferry mail, dispatches and personnel from Korean and Japanese air bases direct to the aircraft carrier decks at sea - a true ship to shore - shore to ship air service.

Seen nicknamed the "Codfish Air Line" because of the Navy Dept.'s official designation of the unit - Carrier Onboard Delivery Unit, TBM Avenger torpedo planes were seen shuttling mail cargo and passengers, from shore to ship and return. The torpedo or "fish" compartment of the aircraft was modified to carry freight and mail bags and the cockpit enlarged to hold five passengers, a crewman and pilot. Aboard the aircraft carriers, crewmen servicing Codfish aircraft soon got into the act and were deck jackets labeled "Codfish Mail Handler", "Codfish Red Cap" and "Codfish Passenger Agent". Souvenir tickets were printed depicting the Korean coastline and overprinted "Good For One Flight, Task Force 77 to Japan or Korea. Good for One Month's Income Tax Exemption". (Military personnel were granted one month exemption for spending one day of any month in a combat area.)

For the air mail cover collector, a few covers carried by this unique service undoubtedly exist and bear some interesting transit markings. The cover illustrated, the only one received from this service, was dispatched by a Naval officer friend stationed in Seoul, Korea and addressed to another officer serving aboard the carrier U.S.S. BON HOMME RICHARD, somewhere at sea off Korea. Dated Oct. 19, 1952 from APO 90 (Seoul) the cover bears a distinctive "VIA CODFISH" marking, handmade, and was cancelled aboard the carrier the same day - a successful shore to ship flight.

The "FREE AIR MAIL" franking indicates the first free air mail franking ever authorized by Congress for military personnel. Free franking as authorized for World War II was primarily for surface mails and service men had to pay 6¢ air postage to get preferential air mail service.

APO cancelling devices, with the name of a foreign country included in the dial, are few and far between. Stanley Jersey sends in the example illustrated. The registry hand-stamp, a double ring date stamp, from Seoul, Korea also has the name included within the double-ring of this APO marking; the Madrid APO has MADT within the dial above AMT.
