The WAR COVER CLUB EXHIBITION OF 1969....

In his recent letter to the editor, the president of the War Cover Club gives his authorization and endorsement for the participation, by the War Cover Club, in the 1969 WESTPEX....approximately 100 frames.

The host group shall be the Bear Flag Post of the greater San Francisco Bay area out in "sunny" California. The support of the entire War Cover Club is required in order to assure the success of the Club's new venture.

There shall be two, perhaps three, groups of war cover postal history only (no topicals); the groups are: military, naval and, depending upon entries, civil. WESTPEX awards Gold, Silver and Bronze in each group (section), more if required, and the War Cover Club shall give an Award for Exhibition (1st) plus 2nd and 3rd place awards. Also, the Bear Flag Post shall give an award to one of the exhibitors. In addition, there are many special awards which could also be won.

Four members of the Bear Flag Post are also members of the WESTPEX Committee. In itself, WESTPEX is one of two major philatelic exhibitions held annually in Calif. It is entirely non-commercial and all the efforts directed to the success of the exhibition is entirely voluntary. This means many many hours of invaluable time given by Committee in the service of WESTPEX. There are absolutely no financial rewards to any of the Committee's work.

Frame space is still \$4.00 per frame and, along with dealers rentals of bourse space, helps WESTPEX to cover costs. The frames are wood-backed, aluminum framed and heavy glass fronted (weighing 20 pounds each). Glass is carefully cleaned and pages very carefully mounted by members of the Committee (or the exhibitor himself may do so). Following the exhibiton the Committee dismounts the pages which are repacked and mailed out the day following along with awards which are to be mailed.

Each frame holds $12-8\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 pages, 9-11 x 11 pages or 12-11 x 11 pages with the 12 inch hinge folded under. Exhibitors are limited to two frames minimum or twelve frames maximum.

If YOU would like to participate in the War Cover Club's first exhibition, please contact the editor. Frame space is now being solicited,

The Bear Flag Post has commitments for about 30% of the frame space but would defer should the frame space be oversubscribed. Of these, Bear Flag Post members have previously won Gold and Silver medals but not in war cover exhibits.

Joe Clary, WESTPEX General Chairman, has opened the door for the War Cover Club to exhibit as a club for the first time. Let us have vote-of-confidence for his faith and for the inspiration of our Club president who started the Club in this new role.

POSTAL STATIONERY OF PUERTO RICO, 1899-1900 Bradley B. Horton

PART II*

Both the UPSS Possessions Stationery Catalog and Scott's U.S. Specialized Catalog list the postal cards of the island possessions and usually give the information about the printer and the quantities printed. This information is not given in these catalogues for the postal cards of Puerto Rico. Therefore, the purpose of these paragraphs is to present the information which may be interesting and useful to collectors who are writing up their collections. Most of the information presented here is from government reports, documents and correspondence although philatelic publications were also consulted.

First Issue: Local Overprints

The first U.S. postal cards overprinted for use in Porto Rico appeared in the United States early in July 1899. They were received in a package of stamps and stationery which had been ordered from the San Juan post office. The invoice of the assortment was signed by W. K. Landis, Acting Postmaster at San Juan, P. R., and listed the cards so the Sterling Stamp Company, which had ordered the cards, believed them to be genuine. J. Murray Bartels, another postage stamp dealer, questioned the legitimacy of the overprint because the U.S. Post Office Department had no record of the cards being issued. The Post Office Department immediately investigated the issue and received the following reply:

DEPARTMENT OF POSTS OF PORTO RICO
DIRECTOR GENERAL OF POSTS
San Juan, July 31, 1899

Hon. E. B. Kellogg,
Acting 3rd Asst. Postmaster Gen.
Washington, D. C.

Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your letter.....of the 15th inst.

There is no communication on record in the Department to show that application has been made for authority to surcharge postal cards.

As there were no postal cards sent with the first surcharged stock to this department, and as there was immediate need for same, it was decided to purchase 13,000 cards of the stock belonging to the Postmaster of Washington and have same surcharged. I would respectfully invite your attention to the letter of Hon. John A. Merritt of the 21st ult. suggesting that stamped envelopes bearing return request, which had been returned to this Department of exchange, be surcharged by the Department. These and the 13,000 cards referred to above are the only supplies that have been surcharged by the Department, and a sample of each is enclosed herewith in compliance with your request.

The postal cards which were overprinted were evidently remainders of the cards supplied to the Island by the Washington, D. C. Postmaster. These remainders were not returned although overprinted stationery was required after March 24, 1899. Enclosed in the above letter were one overprinted postal card and two overprinted envelopes. The card had the local overprint "PORTO RICO", 21 mm. long under the stamp. The base card was the one cent regular U. S. postal card of 1897.

The two enclosed envelopes had 20 mm. local overprints "PORTO RICO". They were the 2ϕ and 5ϕ U. S. envelopes which had been ordered with the Roses & Co. corner card in December 1898. The remainders of the original unoverprinted stocks of 3,000 and 1,000 respectively were invalidated when the overprinted stock was required and were returned to the post office in San Juan. The above letter was the first mention of these envelopes in the United States. J. M. Bartels purchased the remaining overprinted envelopes from Roses & Co.

Second Issue

The second issue is actually the first regular issue since the preceding issue with the San Juan overprint was, strictly speaking, a provisional. The cards of this issue are the same base cards with a similar overprint, the overprint being in a heavier font and slightly longer, 26 mm. long. Ten thousand of these cards were overprinted by Byron S. Adams, a local printer of Washington, D. C. The cards were shipped to the Director General on September 21, 1899. Apparently these cards were not received by U. 3. stamp dealers before December.

Third Issue

In February 1900 new 1ϕ and 2ϕ stamps and 2ϕ and 5ϕ envelopes and 1ϕ postal cards were oredered with the Spanish name of the country, "PUERTO RICO", on the overprint. The requisition called for $25,000^2$ one cent postal cards. Albert Daggett, printer of the U. S. postal cards, apparently did the overprinting. The cards were issued from the U. S. Postal Card Agency at his factory in Piedmont, West Virginia. In this third issue, a smaller type was used than had been used the the previous issues. The overprint, 21 mm. long, was in the Spanish spelling since the Anglicized spelling of the name of the country, "Porto Rico", was not readily accepted by the local inhabitants of the Island.

In framing the laws for governing the Island, The House of Representatives used the Spanish spelling. The Senate, however, advocated the Americanized spelling and the laws were adopted with this spelling. (Finally, in 1932, Congress rechanged the name to Puerto Rico.) During the confusin over the proper spelling of the Island's name, the overprints on the postal paper were changed to "Puerto Rico". Although ordered in February, it appears that these postal cards were not issued until April of 1900.

Integration With U. S. Postal System

On April 12, 1900 the act providing temporary civil government for the Island of Porto Rico was signed. This act, effective May 1st, declared that the island's postal system was to be united with that of the U.S. The local postmasters were ordered to return all their stock to the Director General of Posts. When counted, the \$85,107.77 stock of overprinted stamps and stationery was turned over to the Postmaster of San Juan to be supplied to the other postmasters on the island. As the overprinted issues were exhausted, they were replaced by unoverprinted stamps and stationery.

2) A later Dept. report states that a total of 34,925 cards, of the 2nd and 3rd, issues, were sent. The 75 card differential may have been due to damage in shipment, departmental specimens or spoilage in overprinting.

GUAM ISLAND, 1898 D.D. Howell

On June 21, 1898, the Spanish government of the Island of Guam formally turned over the government to the naval authorities from the U.S. cruiser "Charleston" and the arms and munitions were turned in to the marines from the same vessel. Troops, from the U.S. Army, remained onboard the contract troopships.


On June 20th naval gumners had fired on the Guam fortifications but this was mistaken for salutes (which the Spanish could not return being out of powder). It was on this day that the army had sent ashore a landing party commanded by Col. Owen Summers of which the lst section (first boat) was commanded by Capt. A. L. Heath and the 2nd section (second boat) by Capt. A. F. Prescott, all of the 2nd Reg., Oregon Vols (OMG).

There were naval personnel stationed on board each troopship and, assuming that the navy rowed the army ashore, then the navy first stepped ashore and secured the boats thus being the first on Guam! There were also naval officers in this party and they were to arrange for the formal surrender on the day following.

The two-day visit (to Guam) does not produce much mail. The cover, illustrated below, is the only one known to the writer. It is from a Pvt. J. Verheyen, Co. A. 1st Reg. Cal. Vols., who enlisted in San Francisco and was on his way to the Philippine Islands in response to Adm. Dewey's request for support and reinforcements.

Handstamps on the backside:

- 1) "Soldier's Letter/lst Regt Cal U S Vol Inf/A J Welleher/ Cap't and Adju't"
- 2) San Francisco, Main 1 Aug 2 1 PM 1898 (plus two other markings of that date)
 Handstamps on the frontside:
- 1) "Soldier's Letter"
- 2) U.S. CHARGE/TO COLLECT 2 CENTS
- 3) San Francisco, Main 1 Aug 2 1 FM 1898 tying the 2¢ adhesive postage due stamp.


It is noted that USCG mail frequently bears no postal markings of any kind, even though sent from the Viet Nam areas, not even USPOD markings when placed in regular mails. Naval and army mails sometimes have stateside town markings at the point of entry into the civil mails.

Ed. Hopps wants to know - who was D 25? Illustrated below is the 1914 post-card sent by D 25 to Major General John Saschke at Graz, Austria and mailed from the Wien-Hofburg on July 31st of 1914. The sender tells of the patriotic enthusiasm of the army, of its morale and of the forthcoming war! The embossed white and red seal (in place of any stamp) may be the coat-of-arms of the family of the sender.

CANADIAN MILITARY POSTAL NEWS Capt. R. V. Furneaux

GIFTE ROTATION *

Returning from Cyprus in April (1968) will be headquarters and three companies of the 1st Battalion Black Watch from Canadian Forces Base Gagetown and a reconnaissance squadron of the Fort Carry's from Calgary.

The 1st Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, a battery from the 3rd Regiment, Royal Canadian Herse Artillery and a squadron from the Fort Garry Horse armoured regiment will form the next C_enadian contingent to serve with the UN in Cyprus. The units will begin their 6 months tour of duty subject to the governments approval following a renswal of the forces' UN mandate in December (of 1967).

About 900 Canadians are now serving in Cyprus, including a number on the staff and signals detachments at UN headquarters. In 1966 there was a reduction of about 120 Canadians when the entire UN force was cut in size.



FORCES AIR LETTER LETTRE-AVION POUR MILITAIRES




