THE PARAGUAYAN ARMY POSTAL SERVICE IN THE CHACO WAR 1932-1935 Frederic Patka

Since 1879 Bolivia has sought a land passageway to the sea. The GRAN CHACO, a forest and swamp land in Paraguay, was the only area open to fulfill Bolivia's ambition. Intermittant wars between Bolivia and Paraguay terminated in 1936. The final conflict lasted three years, ending in victory for Paraguay. Considerable war prisoners were taken by both sides. An army postal service had been established for these prisoners.

Various countries, at different times, tried to intervene and offered their good services to end the friction and turmoil which had built up through the years.

In 1928, when the danger of war was very acute, the Pan American Conference was able to adjust the immediate threat, but it was only temporary. The perils of war smouldered until the final declaration of war by Bolivia.

For engaging in a war Bolivia was not quite as strong as Paraguay and events proved that the Paraguayan Forces could in the long run outfight Bolivia; this is what occurred.

The League of Nations and several South American countries tried to submit various mediation proposals; these were satisfactory to Bolivia but not to Paraguay.

At last, in March, 1935, an Argentinian-Chilean proposition was accepted by both sides and this led to a cease-fire agreement on June 12, 1935.

Peace negotiations began on July 1, 1936 in Buenos Aires but not until January 21, 1936 were agreements reached for the exchange of POWs and reestablishment of Diplomatic relations. However, although peace had been declared, the settlement of the territorial question continued until 1937 and was concluded by arbitration. Bolivia had to cede a strip of land of 297,000 km to Paraguay, which was a good part of Bolivia occupied by Paraguayan troops during the war.

ARMY POSTAL SERVICE

The Paraguayan forces had built up a very adequate APO service with various APOs and one Base PO. The service was well organized. APO cancels may be found on the frontside of the covers as well as on the backside. Ordinary mail was free; registered and foreign mail had to be postpaid and were mailed mostly at civil postoffices.

Sometimes soldier's mail may be found also with town-cancels. The mail which had been addressed to Asuncion, the capitol, usually bears a machine cancel of the civil PO on the backside; this mail may be found also without the townmark. On letters to upcountry towns and villages, their PO cancel may be found as an arrival mark. Practically all items bear a unit-stamp and censor-stamp of various designs. Occasionally items may be found with both the unit as well as the censor stamp but lacking the APO or the civil postoffice cancel.

ARMY POST OFFICE CANCELS

In the following I've only reported those which are in my possession or which I have seen. Certainly some others may exist. It is very likely that there existed also some provisional cancels, as all the steel type APOs are dated 1933-1935, and certainly Faraguay had not a standing APO service to be put into operation but had to build it up after the declaration of war.

All the cancels are double-circle steel types 30/20 mm., with the date in one line in the center. All mentioned types are illustrated.

Used inks are mostly black but blue or violet may also be found. The names in the cancels are certainly code-names. Chaco Boreal is the western part of the disputed territory. Bahia Negra lies about 100 km northward on the border of Brasilia on the Rio Otuquis. Toledo may be eventually the fort of the same name in the Chaco Boreal; however this all cannot be said with accuracy.

Unfortunately most of the APO cancels, as well as the unit stamps, are very indistinct and incomplete impressions. This is perhaps due to the immense heat which has a tendency to dry out the ink pads.

Unit Stamps

These are mostly rubberstamps which are circular and rectangular in various sizes. The circular stamps have, in the center, the coat of arms. Inks used are black, blue, red, violet and indefinable mixtures.

The cachets 12 and 14, of the War Ministry, may be found on items from assembling camps at Asuncjon as well as on POW mail from Paraguayan POWs in Bolivia.



CENSORSHIP

The censor-stamps show a very large variation in size and general appearance, such as: rectangular, circular, single and double-line, with and without frame lines and so forth. All possible combinations of inks were used.

Two different censor stamps may be found on the same item. There may also be a hand-written censor-note, as well as a censor-stamp, on the same item, both together.

The censor department distributed leaflets to the troops; this gave instructions for correspondence. Where the soldiers had to be admonished in the national interest, (instructions were): "Do not write about strength of troops, displacements of units, compositions of command posts, etc., not even to his best friend or wife. Do not light camp fires at night; do not betray their position to the enemy aircraft; beware of agents, etc., etc.."

CANADIAN MILITARY POSTAL NEWS F/L R. V. Furneaux

ARMED FORCES TATTOO

(See page 261 June issue.)

The Canadian Armed Forces Tattoo will be performing at 45 locations across the country during 1967, the first performance taking place at Peterborough, Ontario on 31 March. The last performances occur on the <u>Eastern Provinces Tour</u> during the month of October; they are: Le Centre Civique, Drummondsville (2-3 Oct.), Le Centre Georges Vezina, Chicoutimi (6-7 Oct.) and L'Arena, Shawinigan (10-11 Oct.).

Included in the Tattoo establishment are Royal Canadian Postal Corps personnel. These personnel will operate post offices providing full post office service during the Concentration period and the entire tour of the Tattoo. Canadian Forces Bases and Units accommodating The Tattoo during the Concentration period, stadium performance pariod and while the Arena Group is touring Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland and Eastern Quebec will be required to provide adequate secure accommodation for these post offices.

During the period the Arena Groups are aboard the Special Trains, Royal Canadian Postal Corps personnel will operate post offices providing full post office service on the trains. Each train has been allotted an MPO number as follows:

- (1) Blue Group MPO 318
- (2) Red Group MPO 367

(The Eastern Provinces Tour is separate from the two named groups and begins operation on 16 Sep in Summerside.)

The <u>Blue Train</u>, MPO 318, began 17 April in Moncton Stadium, Moncton and finished on the 15 May at Coliseum, Prince George. The <u>Red Train</u>, MPO 367, began 17 April and finished on the 15 May at Kelowna and District Memorial Arena, Kelowna.

Reported but not seen:

Victoria, B. C. - THE CANADIAN ARMED FORCES TATTOO MAY 25 - 27 With reference to the Aug 66 Bulletin, the four-line slogan reading:

ARMED FORCES DAY/JUNE 11 JUIN/JOURNEE DES/FORCES ARMEES has been used in the following cities: Halifax, Windsor, Kingston, Victoria, Reginia, Toronto, Saskatoon, Vancouver and Winnipeg.

CFPO 5049 - UNEF

The Canadian Post Office Weekly Bulletin dated 3 Jun 67 (#2412) states "Effective 27 May 67 CFPO 5049 which served the Canadian element serving in the UNEF ceased operation". Since CFPOs 32, 33 and 35 were also in use with the UNEF it is safe to assume that these too ceased to function close to the same date as CFPO 5049.

CFPO 5048 - SHAPE UQ, Casteau, Belgium

This CFPO became effective 1 Apr 67. Outgoing mail is being cancelled CFPO 5048.

CFPO 105 - CFPO 5000 Lahr, Germany

CFPO 5000 became effective 1 Apr 67 and outgoing mail is being cancelled CFPO 5000. In addition, CFPO 105 may be seen in the cancel of outgoing mail. CFPO 105 previously was used by the RCAF at Grostenquin, France until that base closed on 31 July 1964.

CFPO 5045 - AFCENT, Brunsuum, Holland

The CFPO became effective 15 March 67 for the Cdn Support Unit of AFCENT (Allied Forces Central Europe). I have not yet seen any mail originating from there.

British Troops in Canada

Further to the item on page 261 of the June 67 Bulletin, outgoing mail from the British troops at CFB Wainwright, Alberta 26 Jan 67 to 2 March 67 was cancelled FPO 155 but it is not known what cancel was used for the British troops at CFB Shilo, Manitoba during the same period.

The 1st Bn Green Howards and the 32nd Field Engineer Sqd of the Royal Engineers participated in excercises in CFB Gagetown, Oromocto, New Brunswick from 11 June to 15 Aug 67. Their mailing address was BFPO 619. Outgoing mail was cancelled FPO 1062.

The 2nd Bn Coldstream Guards participated in excercises in CFB Wainwright, Alberta from 14 June to 18 July 67. Their mailing address was BFPO 620; it is unknown what cancel was applied to the outgoing mail.

FORCES AIR LETTER SHEETS


(Further to the news of these FALs on pages 163 and 164 of the June 66 Bulletin) The FAL bearing the imprint "5 A.M.S. (12/63)" at the lower left of the front panel appeared some months ago in another distince variation in that the space between the "LETTRE-AVION and POUR MILITAIRES" is now 4 mm. as opposed to the 2 mm. spacing on all other varieties. The 4 mm. spacing has been observed only on unwatermarked forms.

In Oct 66, I obtained for the first time two other varieties of the FALs bearing the same imprint as noted above. Bothe have a slanted hyphen between "LETTRE-AVION" vice the horizontal hyphen as heretofore. In "AVION" the "V" if much wider than in previous issues. The major difference between the two new varieties is that the 2nd fold line points to "P" of "PLIER" on one and to the hyphen nearest "E" of "HERE" on the other FAL. Another major variety of the corrected spelling of "SENDER'S" FAL of Feb 66, seen only on unwatermarked paper thus far, is identified by the wide spacing (21 mm.) between the dotted lines on the reverse and the words "NO ENCLOSURE PER-MITTED----INSERER". The first group of these forms were issued with such spacing at 11 mm. It should also be noted that the variety mentioned above as having 4 mm. spacing between the words on the front panel have the narrow spacing on the reverse. The 4 mm. variety is also readily distinguished by a rather blurry medium red (ink) printing as opposed to clearer and sharper printing on the others.

Prior to 15 July 67 yet another type FAL was issued. So far it is known to be in use in the Dartmouth, Nova Socia region and around Trenton, Ontario. The usual "FORCES/AIR LETTER/LETTRE - AVION/PPUR MILITAIRES" appeares at the top left of the front panel but the significant difference is the imprint at lower left front panel which reads "43-74-078" (5-66)" and at lower right "5 A.M.S. " The printing is a light red on a pale gray unwatermarked paper.

"ON THE EDITOR'S DESK"

Richard M. Major sends in the cover illustrated below - a military cover from the Republic of Viet'Nam. This features a machine postmark reading "QUAN BUU" and may be the first of its kind. In red ink, the round hand-stamp does not have the words for mail censorship in it, instead just "Quan Buu". For a short glossary of Vietnamese terms please refer to the February Bulletin.



Stanley C. Jersey has two very interesting items. The first is a PB meter tape, the metered marking from APO 96346. The second item is the hand-cancel originating in Bangkok of APO 96303. (Illustrated to right.) APO meter tapes are not commonly found nor are foreign town-names in APO cancels.



Helen Serjeant White transmits the following Australian 1967 slogans and meters:
