Personal letters, from AFVN, now goes free and by air; it is not necessary to write "FREE" upon the envelope. Prior, the only time the AFVN could send personal letters free and by air was when under the temporary jurisdiction of the U.S. Below, illustrated examples of Forces Postal Concession Rates. The 4ϕ rate may not have been proper; the 6ϕ rate is the old rate and the 5ϕ rate is common. Use of the 10ϕ stamp is not often found.

Kevin Rogan reports that Lt. Col. Deloste's latest book can be of great help to War Cover Club members who collect WW I postal history. The book is titled: "Histoire Postale et Militaire de la Guerre De 1914-18". It is a "real encyclopedia" of all postal markings (allied and enemy) used in France during this period. Written in the French Language, the book is well illustrated, has lists and locations, and all cancels are given a value. Briefly the pages are disposed as follows: France (well written-up)-50 pages, POW Camps incld. Internee Camps-21 pages, Allied Missions-8 pages, Great Britain and Commonwealth-16 pages, Belgium-3 pages, U.S.-6 pages, Russia-3 pages, Italy-1 page, Poland-2 pages, Germany-9 pages, etc.. The Second World War, 1939 - 1945

In 1939 the Canadian Postal Corps was again mobilized for active service, and during the course of the war CPC personnel saw service in Continental Europe, United Kingdom, North Africa, Sicily, Italy, Gibraltar, India, Ceylon, Burma, Hong Kong and Kiska (Alaska).

In 1942, the Air Officer Commanding the Royal Canadian Air Force Overseas made representation to the Postmaster General of Canada for the establishment of a postal service within the RCAF, to be manned by Air Force personnel. Agreement was reached whereby 30 members of the CPC would transfer from the Army to RCAF. This group formed the nucleus from which the RCAF postal service developed.

During the latter stages of the war a liaison was established with Royal Canadian Navy units in Belfast, Glasgow and Plymouth, but time was against the implementation of a truly tri-service organization.

In 1943, as a result of increasing pressure for a speedier service on letter mail, 168 Squadron RCAF, familiarly known as the "Mailcan Squadron", was formed for the primary purpose of ferrying mail. The first trans-Atlantic flight was made on 17 December 1943 and, in 30 months of existence, the B-17 Fortresses and later Liberators made 636 trans-Atlantic flights. Shuttle services were also maintained to the continent, the Mediterranean and the Middle East.

There was a natural expansion of the CPC during these years and the strength of the Corps, including the RCAF Postal Service, eventually totalled 5,080 officers, men and members of the Canadian Women's Army Corps (CWAC) and RCAF Women's Division (RCAFWD). Throughout the years 1939-1945 nineteen fatal casualties were reported.

Recent History

The year 1946 saw the disbandment of the Canadian Postal Corps and personnel returned to their peacetime jobs. Most of the former post office employees returned to the Canada Post Office Department.

In 1950 the Korean conflict again raised a need for military postal service. To meet this need the CPC was reactivated on 1 November 1951. As an interim measure, however, between 1 October 1950 and 1 November 1951, organizational postal units were activated under the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps.

On 2 October 1952, as the Special Force, raised primarily as Canada's military contribution for the UN operation in Korea, expanded and was absorbed by the Regular Force, an independent tri-service postal directorate within National Defence Headquarters was created, and the CPC allocated the responsibility for postal services to the Navy, Army and Air Force.

The 11th May 1961 marked the golden anniversary of the CPC and, in recognition of the devoted service rendered by the Corps during the past half century, Her Majesty the Queen on 20th June 1961, graciously bestowed upon the Corps the title "Royal". Henceforth the Corps will be known as "The Royal Canadian Postal Corps".

The most recent addition to the United Nations Forces, despatched to Cyprus in the Spring of 1964, also has among its members a detachment of RCPC personnel to serve the Canadian elements of that Force.


There have been two fatal casualties among RCPC personnel serving with NATO and UN Forces, one in France the other in Egypt.

At the year-end 1964, the RCPC consisted of some 25 officers and 217 other ranks. Of the officers serving approximately half of the total are either ex-post office employees or Second World War Postal Corps veterans, or both. (Continued next page) A small nucleus of the Senior NCOs are in the same category and the remainder of the officers and other ranks have either transferred from other Corps or are direct enlistees. Approximately 125 all ranks are serving overseas at all times.

Currently with the integration of the Canadian Forces the role of the RCPC has not changed; it continues to provide postal service to components of the three services. However the Director now is responsible to the Chief of Logistics and Engineering Division and reports to Director General Transportation within that Branch.

From a loosely-knit organization raised to serve servicemen in times of emergency, the Royal Canadian Postal Corps has emerged as a continuing entity and will continue to make its contribution to the welfare of the Canadian Forces in the future. To this aim the Royal Canadian Postal Corps is dedicated.

The RCPC has representation in Cyprus being a part of the Canadian Forces there (which are a part of the UN Forces or UNFICYP) since 1964. Illustrated below are cancels used on Cyprus:

On orders from Navy Secretary Danials, Flight Commander CDR Towers was not allowed to transfer his flag to the NC-4 so that LCDR Read, in the public's eye, would continue the flight. Due to the terrible weather NC-4 had to remain seven days at Ponta Delgada with the embarrassed Read and the unhappy Towers in each other's company. Towers, deserving better, was not allowed to continue even as a passenger.

May 27th - the weather had cleared sufficiently so that NC-4 took off for Lisbon thus completing the first trans-Atlantic flight later that same day....first across!

The ROCHESTER immediately put out the captain's barge, picked up the awaiting flyers and welcomed them on board. The celebration was just beginning.

(Later the NC-4 continued on to Plymouth, England and arrived there on May 31st passing near Brest, France on the 460 mile trip.)

NOTES ON VESSELS INVOLVED: The ROCHESTER preceded the NC-4. The tanker HISKO and the minelayer AROOSTOOK (served as a seaplane tender for many years) had been sent on ahead to Trepassey Bay, Newfoundland. Station Ships (which were destroyers) were to be located every fifty nautical miles between points of land. Five battleships were to be stationed along the route for the purpose of serving as weather ships but their names are unknown as are the names of other vessels and destroyers serving as Station Ships. The ROCHESTER, Flagship Atlantic Destroyer Force, could communicate with the NCs; the other vessels could not. IONIA, the Greek freighter, rescued the crew of the doomed NC-1. The GEORGE WASHINGTON, American steamer, had intercepted a message from the NCs which, in turn, may have picked up a message from that ship.

NOTES ON NAVAL ARTISTS: LCDR Henry Reuterdahl, USN and LT Charles E. Ruttan, USN were assigned to portray the Atlantic flight attempt by the NCs. At various locations, along the route, they made sketches and line drawings which served as the basis for many fine paintings. (During the World War Reuterdahl applied his talents towards portraying surface operations while Ruttan, who was a naval aviator until March 1918, devoted his time to illustrating air combat operations and painted many fabulous scenes of naval and military aircraft in action.)

POSTAL HISTORY NOTES: Unfortunately the NCs were not mail carrying; no mention has ever been made of mail carried on the flight. Fortunately, ships and shore stations were directly involved as part of the flight plans; the above may be collected if they had a cancel. Rockaway Beach and Chatham were commissioned naval air stations. The first had a cancel in use during 1919; whether or not Chatham had a postal cancel is not known to this writer; none has been seen.

NOTES ON SHIP LISTING: "X" followed by a blank space means the ships or ship is unknown. The HANNIBAL, at Lisbon, may not have been involved. Rockaway Beach - Halifax: 1. McDermut, X.


