THIS ISSUE

While on a vacation in the wilds of Maine the editor had the misfortune to produce a ruptured appendix, which of course necessitated an emergency operation. As a result of this unwelcome event he did not reach home until well into September. Although he had made an excellent recovery, he had not yet regained sufficient strength to undertake much work. This state of affairs will explain the lateness of this issue and the reason why in some respects it is not quite up to our usual standard. It is fully expected that with the following issue we shall be able to resume the type of publication to which you members have become accustomed.

THE SALES DEPARTMENT

The management of the Sales Department has been taken over by Mr. M. R. Baggett. We can guarantee that under his supervision this department will function so as to give general satisfaction, for he has the ability and enthusiasm that make a successful manager. Plans for conducting the department have been worked out with the help of the officers of the Club. By this time members will probably have received from Mr. Baggett a questionnaire asking whether they wish to be listed with the department, and so on. The Sales Department can be made an important activity of the Club if the members give it real cooperation. Almost all of us accumulate duplicate material from time to time. Some of this material can almost surely be of use to other collectors. Why not put it into circulation? Obviously the more material that is offered the more benefit to us all. Do not expect great results from the department if you never put anything into it. The department can dispose of all kinds of war covers, military and civilian, from all wars and all countries. The following directions should be observed in preparing material for submission to the department. All covers should be numbered consecutively and priced on the front in pencil. Each lot of covers should be accompanied by an itemized list giving number, description and price. Send in as many lots as you wish, but send in only good collectable material, no junk, and be sure to keep your prices reasonable. When you receive a circuit send it on with as little delay as possible.

The editors of this Bulletin are ready to receive and would welcome articles dealing with any phase of war cover collecting. Articles may be of any length, though the right is reserved to distribute long articles over several issues. The subject matter should consist of accurate and interesting information which may or may not be based on personal research. This subject matter should be presented in a manner that is concise and to the point. Illustrations to accompany articles will be published whenever feasible. In addition to articles we shall be glad to consider the publication from time to time of descriptions of covers of unusual interest. So take your pen in hand and let your spirit be moved!

A complete collection of Army Postal cancellations, that is a complete set of covers with the APO numbers showing in the cancellation, is going to prove as elusive in attainment as a complete collection of anything else. This will not be true because of the numbers of cancellations or because of difficulties in accumulating the covers by normal means. It will, however, prove true because of the manner in which Army Postal Units are used by the Adjutant General, War Department, D. C., or by Theater Postal Officers.

For quite some time the writer was aware of the existence of Army Postal Units 13, 50 and 599 in the European Theater of Operations, and yet he could not find examples of their cancellations in the mails. An investigation of official records gave the answers, and the information secured did not warrant the writer spending any more time searching mails for these numbers. The explanations were two.

In the first place, Army Postal Units 50 and 599 were assigned to two Corps for operation, the 50th to the xx Corps (apo 340) and the 599th to the VIII Corps (apo 308). Apparently the Army Table of Organization for a Corps does not provide organic personnel for the operation of Corps postal service, and yet the Corps being a major command, it is assigned an APO number which it carries with it as a permanent address wherever it goes. In order to provide a Corps with postal personnel a general assignment postal unit is assigned to the corps for the furnishing of postal service. In operation all such assigned general assignment postal units use the APO number of the Corps to which assigned. Thus the 50th Army Postal Unit cancelled the xx Corps mail with plugs showing 340, not 50; the 599th cancelled VIII Corps mail with plugs showing 308, not 599.

To the collector this is discouraging, and it becomes all the more discouraging when he discovers that there is generally no way in which the situation can be circumvented. As long as the postal unit holds such assignment, it is not in possession of plugs bearing its own number, and there is no way of getting the cancellation by knowing someone! The collector can only hope that Army Postal authorities will find some reason to replace the unit under question and put it into operation on its own, and that rarely seems to happen. (The writer has personal knowledge that APU 599 was put into operation under its own number during the summer of 1945, but he has no knowledge of a reassignment for APU 50)

The case of APU 13 turned out quite differently. This unit was one that had been activated only recently at that time, and it had insufficient experience to be put into operation under its own number. As a result, it was assigned to assist and train under another unit which was in operation. Prior to the time when APU 13 might have been put into operation of its own number, it was decided to withdraw the unit from operation of any sort and transfer the personnel to APU 97 in order to give APU 97 sufficient personnel to fulfill its assigned mission. As a result, even the possibility of securing a cancellation in the future with the number 13 in it was removed.

If then, your collection is shy a few numbers, the explanation may lie in the use to which the Army Postal units bearing those numbers have been put. To ascertain this, official records would be required. Who knows? Some of us may have been lucky enough to catch the right envelope at the right time. (Contributed by Bill Beatty)
