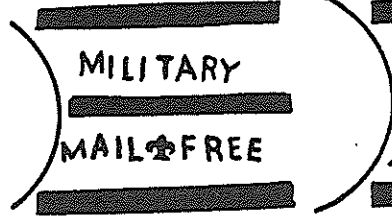
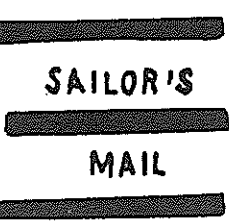
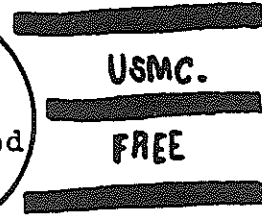
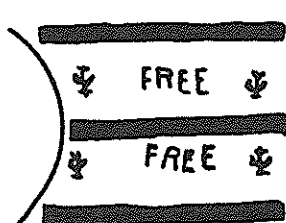




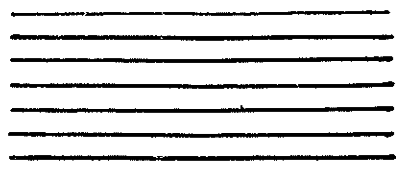
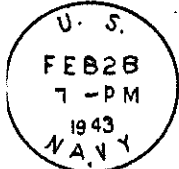
Note: Ordinarily no attempt is made to classify types for reason of variations in width of killer bars, unless the variation is so great as to actually constitute a distinct variety.

S L O G A N S: The Naval Mail Clerks have used the killer bars to eliminate the necessity for

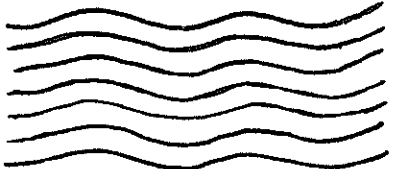
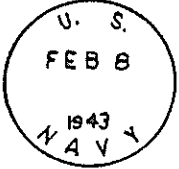

Note: Naval registry stamps are generally similar to those used by the Post Office Department, although some very distinct varieties, such as Q121x, are found. Type Q121x is used by the headquarters of the 13th Naval District.
